All women are at risk for gynecologic cancers for which is important to learn how to lower your risk. CDC's *Inside Knowledge About Gynecologic Cancer* multimedia campaign raises awareness among women and health care providers about the five main types of gynecologic cancer: cervical, ovarian, uterine, vaginal, and vulvar.
