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

## Opportunity for Cancer Researchers with the All of Us Research Hub

2021 data from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System (BRFSS) are now available through CDC's easy-to-use web-based tool. Data topics include health-related risk behaviors, chronic health conditions, health-care access, and use of preventive services. FDA/CTP's New Online Vaping Education Resource Center



The FDA's Center for Tobacco Products (CTP) launched the online



The All of Us Research Program, led by the National Institutes of Health, is inviting one million or more people from all walks of life to participate in creating the most diverse health research database of its kind. The All of Us Research Hub matches a broad research community with a diverse set of research participants. Its goal is to advance precision medicine research and fuel new insights into human health. It provides an interactive Data Browser where anyone can learn about the type and quantity of data that All of Us collects. Users can explore aggregate data, including survey responses, physical measurements, electronic health record information, and wearables data.

**Over 227,740 participants appear in the “cancer” Data Browser keyword search. Cancer researchers can design projects using the over 192 cancer-related electronic health record conditions, 122 labs & measurements, survey questions, genomics data, and more!**

Registered users can use the Researcher Workbench to dive deeper into the data; conduct rapid, hypothesis-driven research; and build new methods for the future, using a variety of tools. The diverse data may help facilitate new studies that could help lead to new insights, treatments, and strategies for disease prevention that are tailored to individuals.
